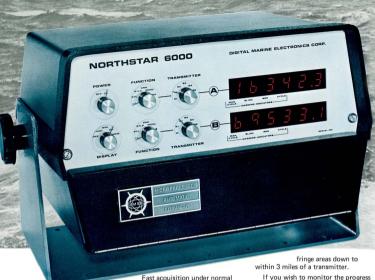

Correct cycle selection is quickly accomplished and accurately maintained. Usually within 1 to 5 minutes after turn-on all warning lights are extinguished.

Fast Acquisition Speed

 A sure sign of careful design and superior performance. rast acquisition under normal conditions gives you confidence that under marginal conditions Northstar 6000 will seek-out and extract everything useful from the selected signals.

Cycle Selection

is fast, decisive, and very accurate. Using a new technique unique to Digital Marine Electronics Corp. (patent applied for) the microprocessor continuously analyzes the signals and refines its calculation of the proper track point. Correct cycle selection is consistently obtained at ranges from deenest If you wish to monitor the progress of acquiring and cycle selection, you may display the MODE of any state to determine its current status.

Simultaneously Tracks Up To Five Slaves

Thus you may swiftly cross-check your vessel's position with any LOP on your chart - each available instantly at the turn of a switch. There is no waiting for the unit to acquire and cycle-select additional LOPs to verify your position. <u>A//</u> receivable slaves of the same GRI are tracked a// of the time.

Turning the TRANSMITTER switch to ALL will automatically display up to 5 TDs sequentially. A MEMORY switch freezes all five TD values at the same instant to make it possible to accurately record a number of LOPs at a given location.

Slave Assign

For convenient reference and continued operations you can assign specific slaves to specific switch positions. Having done it once, you need not do it again. The values are retained even when the set it turned off. They will remain there indefinitely until you change them.

Signal Quality

SNR is continuously and automatically monitored on all transmitters and can be displayed as needed. SNR is a measure of the relative signal strength of a station. It is a microprocessorcalculated value ranging from 0 to 999 to constantly monitor proper performance of the set. The same information is also useful in locating sources of interference. And to find the optimum location for the antenna and ground aboard your vessel.

Your dealer will doubtless use this conveniently available information for the installation and on-board checkout of your new set. And its later servicing and maintenance

Warning Indicators

These advise the user of unusual operating conditions. A "BLINK" light indicates that Coast Guard has detected a transmitter malfunction and is signaling a warning.

The "SNR" light indicates that the received signal is very weak - that it should be used with caution.

The "CYCLE" light indicates that the microprocessor is not yet convinced it is tracking the proper cycle, "MANUAL" cycle light reminds the user that he has set the Cycle Select switch to inhibit automatic cycle selection.

Data Display in either or both readouts is selectable by various positionings of the FUNCTION and TRANSMITTER switches.

For most operations the user will simply display two TDs to fix his position. He may manually select other TDs for Or he may prefer to let the readouts



sequentially display up to five TDs - each with a dwell time of about four seconds.

This information two, or sequentially as many as five. is also useful in checking the overall performance of the Receiver: for locating sources of interference, and the determination of the best antenna and ground location.



The user may enter preset values in order to assign specific Slaves

to specific switch positions. Once entered, they are "remembered" by the instrument until they are changed by the user.



If the user wishes to confirm the progress

of acquisition and cycle selection by the microprocessor, he may display the MODE of any station to determine its present status.



This exclusive feature lets you steer along any LOP you selectvery accurately. Just keep the vertical bar centered. It will



move a step Left or Right to indicate an off-course error of about 50 feet. The other readout shows the distance travelled along that LOP.



Secondary Controls

These are conveniently located on the lower half of the front panel behind a flip-down door. For special purposes, automatic cycle selection may be suspended. TD values may be stepped manually in 10 "usec" increments.

Notch Filters

Even under adverse conditions Northstar 6000 will usually acquire most of the desired transmitters without the notch filters being adjusted. But for extreme fringe area operation, and to reduce interfering frequencies, two externally adjustable and two internally adjustable notch filters are provided.

A solid state LED Interference Tuning Meter is used for greater operating accuracy and longer reliability.

STEER LOP Display

You can accurately steer along any selected LOP guided by a vertical bar of light which moves a step Right or Left to disclose a corresponding off-course error of 0.1 microsecond (50 feet). Either of the displays can be used for this purpose. The second readout monitors the distance travelled along that LOP. Thus you have a very precise pictoral/digital presentation of your vessel's position on the LOP. The flip of a switch conveniently indicates reciprocal course guite as accurately.

And note: you can enjoy the convenience of this feature without disturbing the microprocessor's continuous tracking and SNR measuring. You may shift the displays from one mode to another to steer a course, to verify a fix, or to monitor the set's performance without losing a signal - or waiting for reacquisition and settle.

Antenna Coupler

Attractively styled and permanently sealed in solid epoxy, the antenna coupler unit is furnished with the set. It is designed to mount with standard marine antenna hardware and connects to the receiver by a standard coaxial cable and plug.

Optional Equipment

Ground Isolating Power Supplies for either 110 vac or 110 vdc are available.

A Remote Reading Display Unit, a Graphic Plotter, and latitude/ longitude/course/speed converter are currently under development. Available soon. Ask us about them.
