■ HINTS ON CORRECT WIRING

· Note that direct connection of a proximity switch to the power supply without load may result in damage to the proximily switch. Therefore be sure to connect the switch through a load.



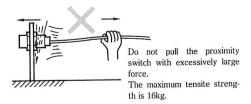
• It a high voltage or power line tuns near the proximity switch cable be sure to wire the switch cable through a metallic conduit to prevent the switch from maifunctioning or damage.

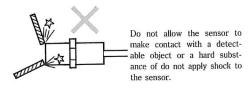


· Be sure to connect the proximity switch by processing its connecting cable end with a solderless terminal. (The solderless terminal is not supplied as an accessory.)

■ HINTS ON CORRECT USE







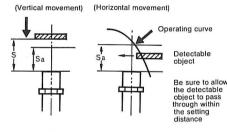
· Avoid using the proximity switch in an atomosphere of chemicals, especially strong alkali acid (such as nitric acid, chromic acid, hot concentrated sulfuric acid, etc.)



How to determine setting distance (for stable operation)

 The detecting distance and setting distance of the proximity switch will vary depending on the shape size and material of a object to be detected. Therefore confirm the proper detecting and setting distance beforehand.

· When a detectable object is smaller than the standard detectable object (iron), the delecting distance will become shorter. However the detecting distance will not become longer even if an object larger than the standaord detectable object is used.

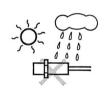


Detecting distance Setting distance = 0~0.8S

(For horizontal movement refer to the operating range diagram shown in the catalog to confirm the proper setting distance.)

 Cable length Extendable cable length is 200m max.

· Avoid using the proximity switch in outdoor locations (subject to direct sunlight, rainwater, ctc.)

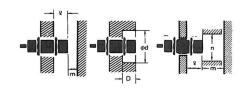

Do not tighten the proximity switch excessively

· Effects of surrounding metals

When a metallic object other than the object to be detected ex ilsts in the area surrounding the detecting head the proximity switch may be alfected by the surrounding metal and may not relese properly. Even it the proximity switch releses properly, a change in the detecting distance may occur by temperature. etc. There fore, be sure to provide a minimum distance from the surrounding metallic object . as specified in Table 7.

Mutual interference

When plural proximity switches are used, the juxtaposed switches may malfunction due to mutual interference.

Therefore, be sure to provide a minimum distance between the two switches, as specilied in Table 8.

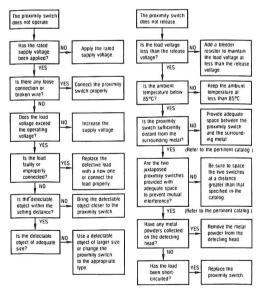
